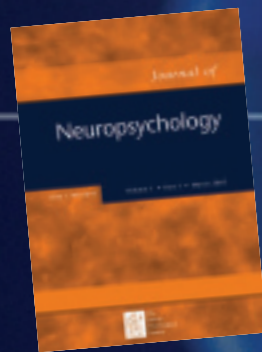

Aim and Scope

The **Journal of Neuropsychology** publishes theory-driven patient studies.
