There is another hotel very near Malmömässan, Quality Hotel View. In the central area of Malmö there are many hotels in different price categories. The train is 8 minutes from Malmö Station to the venue (Hyllie station), and the bus is 20 minutes.

TRAVEL OPTIONS

The conference venue is easily reached by flying into Copenhagen airport (CPH) and then taking a short (approximately 20 minutes) train journey, directly from the airport to the venue. Malmömässan, in Malmö (Hyllie station).

Another possibility is to fly into Malmö airport (MMX), and from there take the bus to central Malmö (approximately 45 minutes), change to another bus (20 minutes) or train (10 minutes) to the Hyllie station where the venue is located.

Malmö can also be reached by train and ferry from some countries.

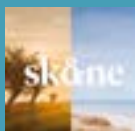
